STUDENTS AT RISK OF FAILING THIS YEAR

To be in good standing and register for courses in the Fall 2005, students must pass more than half of the courses taken over the year, as well as meeting the requirements of their particular program.

Students who do not meet the academic standing requirements of the college or of their program will be expelled. A list of expelled students will be posted outside the Registrar's Office on June 4th.

If you are at risk of expulsion but have reasons which adequately explain your failures, you may make an appeal. An appeals package is available at the Registrar's Office, 2D-6. The deadline to submit an appeal is Thursday, June 17, 2004.

REGISTRATION INFO FOR SUMMER SCHOOL

If you need 3 courses or less to graduate this summer (PRIORITY A), appointments will be available as of May 13 at Academic Advising from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm. After May 13 appointments will be available only during drop in times.

If you are not graduating this summer (PRIORITY B), appointments will be given out starting May 20 from 9-12 at the Information Office. All appointments are for June 3rd.

STUDENTS ON "DEFAULT" WILL NOT BE ISSUED AN APPOINTMENT UNTIL THEY CLEAR THE DEFAULT.

REQUEST FOR REDUCED COURSE LOAD Fall 2004

It is College policy that students register for a full course load.

A full course load is defined as the selection of courses that allows a pre-university student to graduate in two years and a career student in three years. Please check your graduation requirement profile for the courses you are required to take in the Fall 2004 semester.

It is to the benefit of individual students to complete CEGEP within the standard period of time. University admission and job prospects are enhanced by an academic record, which shows that a student has followed his/her academic program according to the regular pattern.

Students who register for a reduced course load will become out of phase in their program and may have difficulty registering for program courses in future semesters.

Students may not register (internet, telephone or in-person) for a reduced course load without submitting a request

Should you wish to apply for a reduced course load you must fill out the confidential request form and supply all relevant information. **Forms can be picked up at the Registrar's office (2D-6) and returned no later than Friday, May 28, 2004 by 4:30 p.m.**
